CATCH—NO CATCH

A CATCH is an act of **firmly** establishing player possession of a live ball in flight. (The word **firmly** was added to this definition in 2006)

A player who leaves his feet to make a catch, interception or recovery must have the ball **firmly** in his possession when he first returns to the ground inbounds with any part of his body or is so held that the dead-ball provisions apply.

If one foot first lands inbounds and the receiver has possession and control of the ball, it is a catch.

Loss of ball simultaneous to returning to the ground is not a catch, interception or recovery. (This item is extremely important. If the receiver goes to the ground, make him show you the ball!)

When in question, the catch, recovery, or interception is <u>not</u> completed. (Has the receiver had an opportunity to do something "common to the game"?)

Great Phrase-The receiver must survive the contact and survive the groud.
